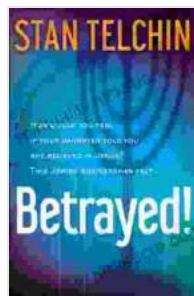


Betrayed: The Story of Stan Telchin, the Man Who Created the Music Industry

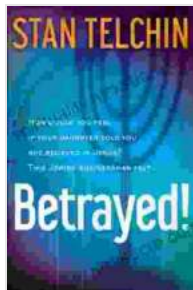

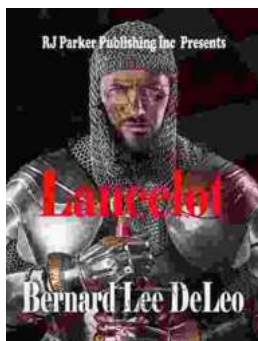

Betrayed! by Stan Telchin

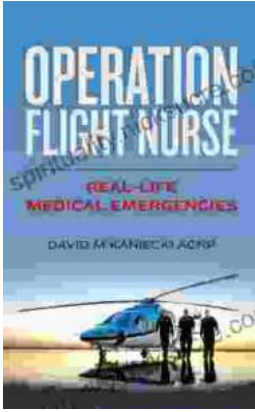
