
From Show to Sport: Centennial of the Association of Former Students of Texas





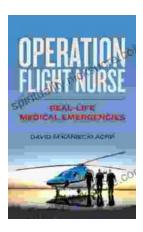
