


Setting the Record Straight on the Top 65 NFL Players of the Past 65 Years



4. Jim Brown

Brown is one of the most dominant players in NFL history. He played nine seasons in the NFL, and he finished his career with 12,312 rushing yards, 106 rushing touchdowns, and 2,328 receiving yards. He was a key member of the Cleveland Browns' championship teams of the 1950s and 1960s.





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
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
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
