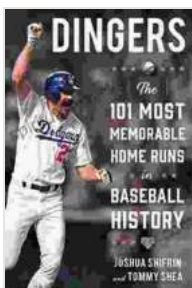


5. Kirk Gibson's home run in Game 1 of the 1988 World Series

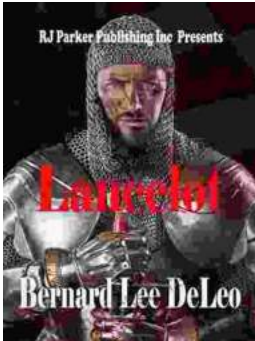

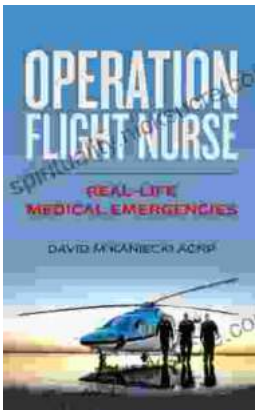
